## Alfa F1 Report

Alfa Romeo Racing scored zero points in the last three outings, cementing their ranking in 8th place in the constructors championship. Only Haas and the hapless Williams team stand between them and last place. Is it significant that both of the other Ferrariengined teams are performing relatively poorly? Giovinazzi has shown flashes of speed in practice, but has been depressingly consistent in the races, placing 14th in each of the last three. Raikkonen has lately been finishing just outside the points-paying positions and had a DNF in Mexico. Maybe things will be better next year, maybe not.

Up front, Lewis Hamilton cemented his sixth driving title with his second place finish in Austin. Teammate Bottas won the race but was second in the drivers championship. Ferrari is still playing second fiddle to the might of Mercedes.

#### Giovinazzi Confirmed for 2020 Alfa Racing Seat

Alfa Romeo Racing on November 4 confirmed Antnio Giovinazzi as a part of the 2020 driver lineup. Team principal Frederic Vasseur stated he was pleased with Giovinazzi's advancement through the season, despite the fact that he had only scored 4 points in the drivers championship. He will remain beside veteran Kimi Raikkonen.

Alfa Romeo's U.S. sales continued at a relatively level pace, about 26% behind 2018, year-to-date. The Stelvio took the most significant hit year to date. The new SUV sold strongly in the last half of 2018, but deliveries have cooled off since. This is concerning as mid-size SUVs are one of the market's hot spots.

## **Future Alfa Product Plans Trimmed**

FCA CEO Michael Manley at the end of October released the revised Alfa Romeo product plan. Gone are the high-performance 8C and the Giulia-based GTV

coupe, as well as a larger SUV. Still in the mix is the C-class Tonale SUV and a smaller crossover SUV. In addition, the Giulia and Stelvio will get facelifts. Both the Tonale and new smaller SUV will offer either hybrid or electric options of some sort. These models are now expected by 2022.

Manely stated: "I am not happy with Alfa Romeo's performance but I remain convinced of its strength." According to the manager, the brand "may return to profitability, although further development will depend on the results."

### FCA and PSA Plan Merger

It was confirmed in late October that FCA and the Groupe PSA are in serious merger discussions. The resulting company would be the 4th largest automobile manufacturer. PSA brands include Peugeot, Citroen, Opel, Vauxhall, and newish luxury brand DS, none of which have a presence in the U.S.

The companies are planning a 50-50 partnership, with FCA's John Elkann as chairman and PSA's Carlos Taveres as CEO. The likely name of the new amalgam isn't yet known. (FCPSA?)

FCA's earlier attempt to merge with Renault ended on the rocks when objections were raised by the French government, a major stockholder. The devil still lurks in the details of this merger and there will still be difficult talks ahead, including the possibility of either or both the French and Italian government raising objections over economic and employment situations.

Could we start to see Citroens and Peugeots sold alongside Alfas and Dodges? Only time will tell.

## Giorgio Platform to Live On

The platform designed as the foundation of the Giulia and Stelvio will be used for other FCA models, according to <u>ClubAlfa.it</u>.

Maserati's new D-class SUV is based on the Giorgio layout as is the next iteration of the Jeep Grand Cherokee. Future Dodge models may also employ the same basic architecture. Owners fortunate enough to have driven a Giulia or Stelvio will tell you that's a good thing for Jeep and Dodge.
