# Alfa 3rd Quarter Sales Down

Alfa Romeo sales for the third quarter of 2023 were down 16% from the same period last year, while YTD sales were down 23%. Only 746 Tonales were sold in the 3rd quarter, compared to 1,753 Dodge Hornets. Dodge delivered a total of 4,350 Hornets for the year, compared to only 863 Tonales.

In all, FCA delivered a total of 380,563 vehicles in the quarter, a decline of 1% from the previous year. The decrease was attributed to higher process on some models and the present high interest rates.

# **Book Review**

*The Atlas of Car Design: The World's Most Iconic Cars*, by Jason Barlow with Guy Bird and an introduction by Brett Berk, 568 pages, Phaidon Press, October 2023, \$150

Could you compile a list of 650 of the most exceptional cars? Neither could I. But somehow the authors have scoured the earth to come up with theirs. Representatives from more than 190 manufacturers and 30 countries are here, each offered with photos and an informative paragraph. Seemingly every significant



car you might think of is here. Not only are the usual icons included, but the ugly ducklings are recognized as well.

The real draw here is the art direction, which combines studio shots with period photos and contemporary advertising. The writing is also first-rate, with its emphasis on each model's design and cultural significance. The British-based authors are forthright with their opinions — indeed, one chapter of the lengthy



preface is titled, "Detroit Invented Automobile Styling. What Went Wrong?"

The book is organized into seven geographical areas, with all eras represented

and each car considered within the context of its time. An index is provided as well as a glossary, list of manufacturers and chronology of the selections. This is a massive work; at 568 pages of high-quality paper, it weighs in at over seven pounds. Understandably, it is not inexpensive. Two versions are offered, the "Onyx Edition" and the "Rally Red Edition," differing in their black and red covers. This book will keep you reading for hours and certainly qualifies for a space on your reference shelf.

# This Unique Alfa Romeo 6C Colli Spider Was Built to Win the Mille Miglia

Commissioned by gentleman driver Giampiero Bianchetti, who raced it to a first-in-class finish at the 1948 Mille Miglia, the unique Romeo 6C 2500 SS Colli Spider was one of the most successful Alfas of the 1940s.



Today, Alfa Romeo is synonymous with achingly beautiful bodywork and pure driving joy. But after WWII, the production facilities in Milan's Portello quarter had been reduced to smoldering ashes. Only a small fraction of their machinery had been safely stored away at Lake Orta before the conflict destroyed the rest. Once its production line had been partially rebuilt, the assembly of road cars slowly resumed, but racing was the life blood of Alfa Romeo. With even the likes of Enzo Ferrari struggling to find success with the 6C 2500 tipo 256, the aim for 1946 was to return to its former racing glory.



Enter Giampiero Bianchetti, a Milanese industrialist and gentleman driver who purchased a rolling chassis from Alfa Romeo, intending to transform it into a unique sports car capable of competing in the 1948 Mille Miglia. Alfa's R&D department supplied him with a dry-sump C46 "Competizione" engine, which was tuned to give Bianchetti's machine an impressive

145 bhp at 5,000 rpm. Unlike the works team racers, which were built as berlinettas, Bianchetti commissioned Carozzeria Colli — who also bodied the factory-built racing machines — to craft him a "Spider" body.

After testing at the hands of famous factory driver Consalvo Sanesi, which gave Alfa some valuable insight for their own racers due to arrive the following year, the unique Colli Spider hit Europe's racing circuits. Bianchetti didn't waste time in seizing glory in his Alfa, taking second place at the Coppa d'Oro in July 1947, and just one month later he came home first at the Circuit di Pescara, followed by two more second-place finishes that year. The next year proved even more successful, with Bianchetti driving his Colli Spider to victory no less than five times in 1948, including at the Targa Florio, and finally a 6th overall and first-in-class finish at the Mille Miglia, securing him the Italian Sports Car Championship.



After making Bianchetti's dreams come true, the Colli Spider made its way to the United States, where it was tragically destroyed in a fire alongside many other historic automobiles. Eventually, the still-wrecked Alfa returned to Italy in 1997 and was restored with painstaking detail between 2002 and 2006 using the original Colli blueprints. Since then, to the delight of the proud Italian spectators, the Colli Spider entered the Mille Miglia every year from 2016 to 2023. Now the uniquely magnificent Colli Spider resides with Messina Classics, who are specialized in consulting and collecting unique dream machines such as this. If you would like your own dream machine, don't hesitate to contact them!

Editor's note: The similarity of this car to the one pictured in the Cooper Technica visit announcement is coincidental. I selected the article before I got the picture and copy for the visit. I'm sure there is a story here and it will be interesting to hear it when we visit Cooper Technica.


