The First Meeting

Russ Whitford remembers the first meeting of the Alfa Romeo Owners Club of Wisconsin

"That's not a Giulietta!"

John Julien said, "No it isn't, it's a 1900C." John described his sleek coupe as "swimming pool green." Didn't matter, what a great car. It was the star of the very first meeting of what would become AROC Wisconsin.

My first Alfisti connection was with Gary Wirth. He introduced me to George Meikrantz, then Jim Huff, John Julien, Joe Mirenda, Paul Newman and on. We decided to meet at Estabrook Park in Shorewood on an early September Sunday, 1978. I think we had eight cars lined up:

George Meikrantz 2600 Spider

Gary Wirth 1600 Giulia Spider
John Julien 1954 1900C Coupe
Jim Huff Giulietta Spider
Paul Newman 1974 Berlina

Russ Whitford 1977 Alfetta (exact same color

as Paul's)

I think there was a ratty Giulia Super and perhaps another car.

We planned another gathering but I don't remember where. At one point we decided to go to an event in Madison where AROC Western Wisconsin met. After talking with those guys, they admitted their chapter was folding and they turned it over to us. George became president and I wrote the newsletter.

Early AROC Wisconsin activities included tech sessions dealing with the mysterious SPICA fuel injection that the EPA had foisted on us. Alfa didn't put out much maintenance information for this system as they abided by the EPA's intent that the owner shouldn't mess with an emission control device. We had to figure it out on our own. Jim Hewett, who owned a really hot Berlina, was instrumental in this voyage.

Gary and I drove to the Alfa Convention in Detroit a year later. Jim Hewett and his wife, Elaine, flew their plane there. We shared Gary's Giulia Spider for the autocross event. All had a great time. Sadly, Jim and Elaine's plane crashed in Lake Michigan on their return home. I was the last to see them.

We put newsletters on the counter at Tosa Imports and a few sports car repair shops like Coach House

Racing. I carried a stack in my Alfetta and put them on any Alfa windshield I saw. The club grew and we had more events.

I have a confession to make, as newsletter editor, I had a stated policy that anyone, AROC member or not, could put a classified ad for an Alfa in our newsletter. I had the stipulation that a price must accompany the ad. My reason was that a price is useful information to members. Those calling me to place ads confided in me. "I really want \$2,500 but put \$3,000 in the ad." With that intel, I would perhaps bargain them down to \$2,200 and buy the car. One year I think I bought six Alfas that way. The standout was my 1959 Giulietta TI for \$75. Gary and I slapped it back together and vintage raced it for a few years. It resides in Tom Zat's museum.

I have vivid memories of the close friends made with our Alfa connection. Bill Hall wrote a nice piece about Tom Schmock and Mark Thompson in the last newsletter. I'll see if I can add some stories about these early AROC-WI founders.

U.S., EU Elections Could influence Future Alfa Romeo EVs

CEO Jean-Philippe Imparato hopes to launch a large, sporty SUV along the lines of the Ferrari Purosangue that will be aimed at the U.S. and China in 2027, but geopolitical and market trends could favor a small hatchback instead.



The new Milano Small SUV (here seen camouflaged) will be introduced April 10. There are no current plans for U.S. sales.

Arese, Italy - Alfa Romeo executives say the outcome of European elections in June and the U.S. presidential election in November could influence which cars it will launch in 2027.

In the U.S., a return to the White House for Donald

Trump could mean a delay or freeze in plans for states to follow California and effectively ban internal -combustion cars starting in 2035. Trump could also roll back President Joe Biden's Inflation Reduction Act incentives for selling EVs made in the U.S. or with a high level of U.S. content.

In Europe, a new EU Parliament could reconsider a plan requiring zero-emission vehicle sales starting in 2035.

That could put a brake on future Alfa Romeo models that are intended to be mainly full electric, including a planned fastback SUV on the STLA Large platform, Cassino, which already builds the Giulia and the brand CEO Jean-Philippe Imparato told reporters Thursday at the Alfa Romeo museum here, near Milan.

"My gut would call for giving to Alfa an electric sports car similar to the (Ferrari) Purosangue (large SUV), but

we also have to watch how geopolitics and global markets could evolve, eventually choosing a more Europe-oriented small hatchback," Imparato said.

Alfa Romeo's product plan is frozen until 2026. Before year-end a decision will be made on whether the new product for 2027 will be the large SUV aimed mainly at North America and China or a small electric hatchback focused on Europe. Imparato has said that the large SUV is crucial to help Alfa Romeo meet its goal of generating 40 percent of sales fromm outside Europe, up from 18 percent now.

Imparato said he is convinced that developed markets including Europe and the U.S. will eventually go electric-only, but that the path to get there is not yet clear and could include bumps or detours.

Alfa Romeo on April 10 will unveil its first fullelectric car, the Milano small crossover. It will go on sale in September in markets where EV demand is strong, including France, the Netherlands and the Nordic countries.

A 48-volt mild hybrid version will be launched by the end of the year, targeting markets where electrification is lagging such as Italy and Spain. The Milano will be sold in Turkey, North Africa, and Latin America starting in 2025.

Stellantis is preparing its plant in Cassino, central Italy, to build cars on the STLA Large platform, including the second-generation Alfa Romeo Stelvio midsize SUV expected in the second half of 2025. It will be followed by the replacement for the Giulia midsize sedan.

Stelvio, as well as the related Maserati Grecale midsize SUV, will be the only Stellantis plant in Europe to build STLA Large-based vehicles. The platform will feature an 800-volt electric architecture and offer a range of more than 700 km (435 miles) for SUVs and an even longer range for sedans.

The Giulia and Stelvio replacements will also have ICE variants, but no details have been revealed. These models will use different, more sporty suspensions from North America vehicles using the STLA Large platform, such as the freshly unveiled new Dodge Charger, Imparato said.

Imparato also said the new Stelvio will be the first Stellantis model to debut two new technologies: the STLA Brain proprietary operating system and the STLA SmartCockpit human-machine interface.

Some of the SmartCockpit features could be previewed at a Stellantis capital markets day planned for June 14 in Auburn Hills, Michigan, Imparato said.

Alfa Romeo will return to the compact hatchback segment in 2028, according to a product plan shown at the event near Milan. A successor to the Giulietta will be built on the STLA Medium platform, which is being installed at Stellantis' factory in Melfi, Italy, Imparato said. The STLA Medium architecture is debuting this year on the Peugeot 3008 compact SUV, which has up to 700 km of electric range.

He added that a successful future Giulietta could generate, with reasonable investments, other body styles including a coupe, a convertible, and a two-seat roadster to reconnect with the iconic Duetto made famous in the U.S. by Dustin Hoffman in the 1967 movie "The Graduate." 🚜


