CAROC is organizing a drive to the Woodstock Opera House, Saturday, September 21. The group will leave from the Buttermilk Restaurant, 7 W. State Street, Geneva, Illinois, at 9:00 a.m. The tour traces a circuitous route covering approximately 150 miles of back roads in Northern Illinois, ending at the Woodstock Opera House for a private tour at 2:30 p.m. A

lunch stop is planned and dinner will be at the More Brewery in Huntley.

The Woodstock town square is notable as the back drop for the movie *Groundhog Day*. The Opera House dates from 1889 and claims to be one of the oldest continuously operating theaters in the country. The building, on the National Register of Historic Places, was restored in the mid 1970's and has stories to tell.

This includes ambulances with certified paramedics, tow-vehicles, and insurance coverage, giving us carte blanche to create a fantastic event.

We believe this will be an excellent opportunity for vintage car owners to enjoy track time without the fear of collisions in the corners. Classroom sessions will be included to help educate and boost members' driving confidence.

On Saturday, October 5th, we will host a Member Gathering and Picnic. A designated area has been reserved for vintage car owners to showcase their vehicles, with Group 1 under their usual large tent in the paddock.

Designated area for vintage vehicles only, located across from the pit lane entry (as specified on map, below). We have a prime location for high visibility so all attendees can see the rare collection our members and guests will be bringing. This is an opportunity to host an event inside an event. Cost of \$15 per car, to cover insurance.

Solo Track Sprints

In addition, we have negotiated the ability to participate (both Group 1, and VSC, Wisconsin Alfa Romeo Owners Club Members, and guests) in the weekend's Solo Track Sprints. Standing-start solo laps begin at pit lane and exit to the paddock at turn 5 after the lap has been completed.

There will be two 40 Minute Sessions Per Day - at least 3 laps per session per driver. Times will be posted at end of day.

Solo Track Sprints will be open to all with a cost of \$75.00 per day. Signup will be available online and in -person on the day of the event as long as they have not sold out.




According to Magnetomagazine.com, the auction house Christie's has agreed to buy U.S.-based Gooding & Company in a deal that will close towards the end of 2024. When consummated, Gooding will become the automotive department of the parent company and be renamed Gooding Christie's. The current Gooding & Co. team is expected to remain largely intact.

Christie's, dealing in art, antiquities, and luxury goods, was established in 1766 and operates in 46 countries. In 1972, it established a collector car department which it operated until its closing in 2007.

Owners David Gooding and wife Dawn Ahrens founded Gooding & Co. in 2003. Gooding's prior experience included serving as managing director of the International Motor Sports department at Christie's and president of RM Auctions. The company has been the official auction house of the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance since 2004.

Christie's and Sotheby's, established in 1744, are intense rivals, vying for the title of largest auction house in the world. Sotheby's acquired a 25% stake in RM auctions in 2015, forming RM Sotheby's. The two companies will now be competitors in the collector car market.



Fiat To Pause 500e Production

According to <u>Automotive News Europe</u>, Fiat will pause production of the BEV



Fiat 500e for four weeks starting September 13 due to slumping market demand for electric vehicles, particularly in Europe. Fiat joins Toyota, GM, and Volvo in making adjustments to its electrification plans. It is now saying that a new hybrid version of the 500 is being prepared for 2025-26 and work is proceeding on new more efficient batteries.

Italy has a launched a \$1 billion incentive plan to help consumers ease the transition to EVs, but progress is slow and resistance steady.

Mille Miglia: The Most Beautiful Race in the World
