Alfa's U.S. Sales Down 19% Year Over Year

FCA US reported its 2024 annual sales results January 3. In total, the company sold 1,303,570 units, a 15% decline since 2023. The press release, however, noted that *retail* sales (as opposed to fleet sales) had increased 1% in the 4th quarter, versus the same period last year, and that the company held the highest market share in PHEV vehicles at 41%.

Sales of Alfa Romeo were 8,865 for the year. The Tonale was top seller at 3,383, closely followed by 3,162 Stelvios. Dealerships sold only 2,320 Giulias. The badge-engineered Dodge Hornet, at 20,559 units sold, outsold the Tonale by 6 to 1.

Much was made of FIAT's 153% annual sales increase (1,528 vs 605), due primarily to deliveries of the new 500e, the "2024 Urban Green Car of the Year."



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Stellantis Production in Italy Falls 37% in 2024

Passenger Cars at Lowest Level Since 1956

MILAN — Stellantis's production in Italy fell by 37 percent last year, according to union figures, as the automaker tries to recover from a deep sales and profitability slump.

The FIM-CISL union on Dec. 3 said that Stellantis assembled 475,090 vehicles in Italy, down from 751,384 in 2023. Production of passenger cars in particular shrank by 46 percent to the lowest level since 1956, while output of light-commercial vehicles fell 17 percent.

To address overcapacity in Italy, the group has relied heavily on state-funded temporary layoff programs. Stellantis in December presented a plan to boost production, but an increase is only expected from 2026 thanks to the launch of new models. Production at the historic Mirafiori factory in Turin is expected to be paused until the third week of January.

Stellantis was not immediately available for comment.

Like its European peers, the world's fourth-largest car maker is wrestling with weak demand, especially for fully electric vehicles, regulatory uncertainty and tough Chinese competition.

FIM-CISL said it would join a protest planned in Brussels by a labor organization, IndustriALL Europe, on Feb. 5, two weeks before the European Commission presents its "clean industrial deal."

The union's leader, Ferdinando Uliano, said it was important to review EU targets for vehicles' carbon emissions reduction due to kick in from 2025. "This is a battle for Europe," Uliano said, speaking about the crisis facing the European car industry. "Single countries can only lose."

Stellantis operates five car plants in Italy plus a facility for commercial vehicles. Production at the group's Mirafiori plant in Turin fell by 70% last year. Only the Maserati plant in Modena, the heart of Italy's "motor valley," performed worse with a 79% drop.

"We are very worried about Maserati," Uliano said. "We expect quickly a clear and detailed project for Maserati."

Stellantis in December pledged to invest €2 billion (\$2.1 billion) in Italy in 2025 to produce new models at some of its plants in the country.

Under the plan, Stellantis will keep all of its Italian factories open and increase output starting in 2026 thanks to the launch of new models. All Stellantis plants in Italy will have production allocations until 2032 and will not require public funds for planned investments, the automaker said.

Hammonds Plan Great Lakes Tour

Detroit AROC members David and Andrea Hamond love northern Michigan. They were responsible for organizing last year's AROC convention—Alfas by the Lake—featuring some of their favorite sites in the Traverse Bay area. AROC-WI president Randy Swanson was a participant and liked what he saw. Randy made the *Alfanatic* aware that the Hammonds are planning another summer excursion.

The pair is proposing a two-week tour for next June. Split into four segments, the adventure begins with a reprise of last year's convention, then continues into the U.P. Participants are invited to join the tourers for any part of the itinerary.

Part 1 Starting June 1, The Crooked River Lodge, near Petoskey is the hub for a repeat of last year's convention drives on the northeastern shore of Lake Michigan and Traverse Bay.

Part 2 Tourers will head north for four days, visiting the varied sights of the northeast U.P. along the southern shore of Lake Superior.

Part 3 The drive will then head west and north along Lake Superior for a three-day exploration of the Keweenaw Peninsula.

Part 4 The participants will complete the loop, spending 3 days in the southwest U.P and northern Wisconsin before heading east.

tures the history, technology, gadgetry and, yes, some vehicles, from the 007 movies. It's titled:

Once we arrived, we walked through several rooms of displays and information about the movie series. Background on the inventions, stunts, villains, and, of course, various femme fatales, is included. Video clips of well known chase (with 007 behind the steering wheel) and action scenes over the decades are shown.

The famous Aston Martin DB5, which had its debut in 1964's Goldfinger, is prominently displayed with explanations of its "vehicle options." Cars from some of the other movies are



on display as well. Boats, motorcycles, and jetpacks, shown in action videos, are other transportation modes in the exhibit.

Even if you have not seen all of these movies, it's DEFINITELY worth a visit to the MSI for this. The exhibit has been extended through Spring 2025. The extra cost for a ticket is money well spent. Plus, you can see the other transportation exhibits and displays in the museum: model trains, the Pioneer Zephyr, the U-505 Submarine, vintage cars, and aircraft.



The Old School Alfa Romeo That Rules the Streets of Brooklyn

I first started driving when I was 15, in 1968, right when there were a number of great sports cars on the road. The Alfa Romeo "Duetto," as it is nicknamed, comes from that era, and is most known from its appearance in the film "The Graduate."



I have lived in Brooklyn for 26 years, longer than I have lived anywhere else, and, for 21 of those years, I have driven

this Alfa Romeo. One of the allures is the connection it gives me to where I live.


New York is a city of immigrants. This car was first imported into America from Italy in the '60s in three colors—the colors of the Italian flag: red, white and green, like my car.



I drive the car wearing a New York Mets hat. The vintage license plate is the same colors as the hat. And as any good New Yorker knows, 1969 was the year the "Miracle Mets" won the World Series.

The car sits at the nexus of people who live and work in Brooklyn, who come from all over the world. I maintain the car at a

shop that was started by Sicilians, but now is run by an Israeli. I park it in a local garage run by a guy from Gambia. I am having it restored at a shop run by a Jamaican proprietor. They all make up the fabric of this community.
