Alfa Romeo Going Battery Electric Only? Not So Fast!

For a year or more now we've been hearing that Stelantis' direction for new Alfa models would be solely BEV-powered by 2027. Things like 1,000 hp, fast charging, and extended range were on the menu, while 4 and 6 cylinder gas engines were on the way out.

Lately however, U.S. management appears to be changing its tune. Motorl.com and other sources quote Chris Feuell, Alfa's U.S. brand CEO, as saying the shift to an all-electric product line would be too restrictive for its 110 dealers. The same may be true in Europe as automakers are struggling to economically justify meeting the upcoming EU emissions goals.

The new Stelvio and Giulia models are based on the Stellantis STLA Large platform which is capable of housing both electric and gas powertrains, so its reasonable to assume that a gas or hybrid version of those models would follow close behind the electric versions. In the meantime, there's a healthy stock of 2024-25 models to choose from. Expect discounts, incentives, and lease deals soon.

Next-Gen Giulia a Crossover?

...That's the speculation generated by a French magazine's interview with Santo Ficili, appointed last October as Alfa Romeo's boss, succeeding Jean-Philippe Imparato, now head of Stellantis Europe. He stated that the second generation Stelvio is on schedule for 2025 introduction and that the new Giulia will have "a new design and a new type of bodywork. Its platform will be the same as that of the Stelvio. So you can imagine what kind of vehicle we will offer." His statement has been widely interpreted to mean the new Giulia will skew more to a crossover design.

Ficili stated that the basic STLA Large platform has been modified to suit Alfa's needs but the article's author observes that the basic dimensions of the platform dictate that the Stelvio and Giulia will be larger overall than the models they replace.

As to electrification, the author observes that Stellantis has announced that the upcoming Lancia Gamma and DS model N°8. will be "multi-energy" vehicles. It's highly likely that Alfa Romeo will follow suit.

Remembering Roy Ferrari



Our friend and fellow AROC-WI member Roy Ferrari passed on January 9, 2025, just 10 days short of his 94th birthday. Roy and Marion joined the Alfa Romeo Owners Club in July 1991. Over the years they made many dear friends. Marion very much enjoyed her 164 and Roy his 1993 Spider Veloce. Roy served as our AROC chapter president in 2009 and 2010.

After graduating in 1952 as an Industrial Engineer, Roy joined the Air Force as a cadet to become a pilot. Following flight school in Florida and then Oklahoma, he found himself flying the F-86 Sabre jet. He was set to go to Korea, but the conflict ended first.

After honorable discharge, Roy started his career as Transmission Engineer for Massey Ferguson Tractor Company in Detroit. He soon moved on to a position as Sales Engineer for a Detroit area conveyer company where he stayed for 12 years. From there his career advanced in progressive sales positions with other companies dealing with automated retrieval and storage systems. This required family moves from Detroit to Cleveland to the Milwaukee area, to Chicago and finally back to the Milwaukee area where he ended his career with Harnischfeger as Sales Director.

Befitting Roy's successful career in technical sales, the January 2010 Alfanatic posted his Spider for sale in the following classified ad:

> 1993 Alfa Romeo Spider Veloce Up for adoption from long-term, caring home. Striking Alfa Red over black leather, Alpine stereo, fitted car cover, original paint, always garaged, 51k miles, 2nd owner, fastidiously maintained with references available. Glorious top -down Italian motoring for the price of an exrental Kia.

Roy was a sports enthusiast having played baseball in high school and college. He was offered the opportunity to go into the minor leagues as a third baseman but his parents said no, much to his disappointment. He played tennis and golf most of his life but enjoyed downhill skiing the most. He won two or three gold medals in his age group for competitive downhill slalom ski events sponsored by *NASTAR*.

I remember Roy's story of skiing in Aspen, Colorado with a group of friends. They were waiting to be seat-

ed at an area restaurant when basketball player Michael Jordan came in with what appeared to be three bodyguards. Jordan and his group were immediately seated. As Roy was the owner of a Ferrari 308 GTS and a member of the Ferrari Club of America, he knew that Michael Jordan was also a Ferrari owner. When Roy's group eventually got in, he went up to Michael, presented his business card, and said, "Michael, I know you have two Ferraris but you've probably never met a real Ferrari." The three guards were giving him dirty looks. Michael got up and shook his hand (which Roy said felt like shaking a first baseman's glove) and said, "No, you're wrong, I have three Ferraris."

Roy was a true car guy who could relate well to all people. He will be missed, but his warm caring nature will never be forgotten.

The 2025 Detroit Auto Show

Formerly known as the North American Show, the renamed

event returned to its traditional January dates for 2025 after taking a break in 2024. The 2022 and 2023 shows were held in September following two years of Coronavirus-related June show cancellations. The venue was Huntington Place (Cobo Hall, renamed) in downtown Detroit - the only part of the United States directly north of Canada.

After entering the hall, one was struck by the wall lined with vendor booths and tables, which was enticing for all wanting to troll for freebies, but surrendering email addresses and contact information was part of the deal. Long gone are the days of glossy oversized car model brochures, hence no clutter.

The main aisles in the exhibition space were wide enough, and when I arrived at opening time it was not overly crowded among the individual show cars. I have never seen so many Detroit Lions jerseys, sweatshirts, and hats, worn by fans supporting the team's playoff run. While some manufacturers (e.g. GM, Ford, Stellantis, and Toyota) held much of the floor space, all car makers were represented.



Each auto show, in addition to the usual and expected vehicles, features some special cars - concepts, customs, and collector cars. Concept cars included the Cadillac Opulent Velocity, the Chrysler Halcyon, the Buick Wildcat EV, and the Ford Electric F150 Lightning Supertruck EV Demonstrator. Minority-owned customizer Foxxtecca had two low-rider vintage Chevys on display, and the local collector car dealer Vanguard Motors had several cars from the 1950s and

1960s. Hagerty Insurance, brought some television cars and movie or movie-inspired cars.

Crowds gathered around the rotating platform with the Ford Mustang GTD Performance Supercar, "Spirit of America" (800+ hp, 200+ mph, \$300M+). "Owwdee and Trailer" was a curiosity from Audi, and a Toyota Tundra featured an outer swiveling driver's seat and a wheelchair lift, as an example of their "Mobility Adaptive Solutions."

I stopped at the Alfa Romeo space to look at the 2025 models, and to speak awhile with the company's representative. I explained that I am a member of two active clubs (in Illinois and Wisconsin), whose members own vintage and modern Alfas. I did make a point of showing him pictures of my two Series 3 Spiders, including those I took while at Chicago's Columbus Day Parade. I think - no, *I know* - I made him jealous. :>)

In a separate section was The Gallery of "Ultra Luxury Vehicles." As one might expect, Ferrari, Maserati, Aston Martin, and Lotus, among others, were neatly arranged in rows for the great unwashed to ogle as they strolled by, perhaps while wondering how hard it could possibly be to hot-wire them. (Impossible.)

German-based Benteler showcased its automotive technology and components. A driverless vehicle, "Mover," from the U.S. / Israeli company Mobileye was interesting. These are indications of things to come, most likely.

The Detroit Grand Prix, an IndyCar Series event, had a presence, with a winners podium for picture-taking, and many colorful posters from previous years' races mounted to pillars. Adults and kids alike waited in line to attempt to squeeze into a race car.

Some show-goers opted for a ride on one of the test tracks. The sound of squealing tires from sharp turns could be heard throughout. While the speeds were not that high, the acceleration was very quick. Jeep's "Camp Jeep" and the Ford Bronco "Built Wild Track" offered man-made off-road experiences with various steps, ramps, and inclines - up, down, and sideways, almost like a slow-motion roller coaster.

Vendors abounded in the lobby outside the main hall, and in the lower hall were rare and in some cases, highly customized cars owned by members of the community. This resembled a very large, climate controlled, cruise night - sans owners in chairs.

As previously noted, the show was not held in 2024. The September date was skipped to allow time for planning a return to January in 2025. According to the Michigan Business column of the *Detroit Free Press*, the event organizers were pleased with the show's return to January, and optimistic that reclaiming its position as the year's first auto show in North America will lead to continued success.
