

## 2026 Stelvio to Get PHEV 1.6L Engine?

Platform shared with next Jeep Cherokee

According to French site <u>Italpassion.fr</u>, a PHEV version of the new Stelvio will be introduced following the initial BEV version. The motor. A 1.6L EP6 PHEV, is being produced in Hungary. Rumors claim that this will be the gas engine of choice for both the new Giulia and Stelvio models. The same motor, to be produced in the Dundee, Michigan plant, is slated to power the next generation Jeep Cherokee which will also use the STLA Large platform.

While it may be stretch to say that the Stelvio will be an Italian version of the Cherokee, they will at least be related.

## The Cuneo, Pininfarina's Wedge

The Last 33 Stradale Variant Adapted from Routeclassiche

A small series of styling exercises were created on the chassis and mechanics of the 1967 Alfa Romeo 33 Stradale, the last of which was presented at the Brussels Motor Show 54 years ago. Its name is "33 Spider," renamed "Cuneo," (wedge), for its very distinctive design theme.

In 1971, the Alfa Romeo 33.3 sports racer finally achieved its competition potential. It won the 1,000 km of Brands Hatch, the Targa Florio, and the 6 Hours of Watkins Glen that season, ahead of very strong competitors, placing second overall in the World Championship for Makes. That same year, Pininfarina exhibited a new concept car at the Belgian Motor Show based on the 1967 33 Stradale, employing the 230 hp two-liter V8 engine developed by Autodelta. That concept, called 33 Spider, used the plat-



form of an earlier Pininfarina prototype, the 1968 P33 Roadster. This original two -seater was dismantled to be reborn with a completely new shape.

But let's go back to our 33 Spider, immediately renamed "Cuneo" for its sloping line, dominated by the doorless triangular sides, which have a low, sleek nose as their vertex. The front is characterized by a "mouth" surrounded by a large black band, with a battery of headlights in the center protected by Plexiglas. The tail is absolutely vertical, a clean cut on

which six round tail lights and eight exhaust ports, one for each cylinder, stand in relief against a jet black rectangle. Two slender fins rise above the rear fenders. A broad orange strip runs longitudinally and the windshield is wraparound and almost horizontal. The elements of the Alfa Romeo emblem are rendered in relief on the nose stripe, and a traditional round emblem appears on the tail. Narrower orange stripes run above the rockers and a Quadrifoglio appears on both rear flanks, with a Pininfarina logo near the nose.



## **A Topless Spider**

The two seat passenger compartment is completely open, lacking any provision for weather protection. A metal roll bar running behind the seasts and supported by a central brace is the sole visible nod to occupant safety. A large tachometer is positioned in front of the driver while five secondary instruments are inserted in a band in the center of the dashboard. The steering wheel is in the shape of an inverted cone, with the four spokes inclined towards the column. Behind the passenger compartment the carburetors' intake trumpets protrude from the flat bonnet, protected by an orange cover.

#### **Road Derivation**

The light alloy wheels are those of the 33 Coupé Stradale, with 5.25H13 front and 6.00L12 rear tires. The engine is the longitudinally mounted OHC 2 liter V8 from the Tipo 33 produced by Autodelta between 1967 and 1969. It is mated to a six-speed gearbox. The theoretical speed of the Cuneo is 195 km/h (~120mph). The Cuneo measures 4.10 meters by 1.8 meters, with a height of 90 cm (roughly 161" x 71" x 35"). And although the 1968 P33 was dismantled, its successor, the 33 Spider Cuneo, still exists and is in the collection of the Alfa Romeo Historical Museum in Arese.
